Loïc Wacquant is Distinguished University Professor of Sociology and Anthropology at the New School for Social Research, Professor of Sociology at the University of California-Berkeley, and a Researcher at the Center for European Sociology in Paris. His interests comprise comparative urban marginality, the penal state, bodily crafts, racial domination, and the politics of reason. His recent books are *Body and Soul*, *Ethnographic Notebooks of an Apprentice Boxer* (2004), *Deadly Symbiosis: Race and the Rise of Neoliberal Penalty* (2005), and *The Mystery of Ministry: Pierre Bourdieu and Democratic Politics* (2005). His ongoing investigations include a carnal anthropology of desire and domination and a historical sociology of racial rule on three continents. He is a co-founder and editor of the interdisciplinary journal *Ethnography* and a regular contributor to *Le Monde Diplomatique*.
